10,000th Foundation Trust Member




On the 8 December 2008, the Foundation Trust Membership Office was very proud to recruit their 10,000th member, a milestone of achievement for the Trust.

From Your Patient & Carer Governor's



It is now almost a year since our election as Foundation Trust Governors and I am sure that you would like to know what we have been up to. It has been quite a busy 12 months, which started with induction sessions and continued with training on various aspects of Trust activities and responsibilities including governance, membership, targets and performance, and finance. We also attended a session to explore handling different situations we might encounter as governors.



During the year, we have attended and made representations at Trust meetings, including the Divisional Strategic Reviews, Patient Experience sessions and, of course, the three formal Membership Council meetings. Of particular interest were the Clinical Audit Project presentations and the Infection Control Team "Space to Innovate" event, where new solutions to problems were explored.



We have also contributed to open public meetings and, in a wider context, meetings held under the auspices of the Strategic Health Authority and the local Primary Care Trusts. In Nov 2008, a number of the Trust's governors attended a Foundation Trust Network event, where we met with other governors from across the South West and shared experiences.



Three governor working groups have been set up to focus on Quality and Strategy and Involvement, in addition to a formal sub-committee: the Nominations and Appointments Committee. The Nominations and Appointments Committee has been quite busy, with Governors involved on the interview panel to appoint Non-Executive Directors and to recommend levels of remuneration for the Chair and Non-Executive Directors, which were subsequently approved by the full governing body, the Membership Council.



There is no doubt that all of this has contributed to the growing level of confidence that Governors now demonstrate, and the Trust has been very supportive in this process.




Governors have raised various issues on your behalf:

- Removal of carpets in hospital areas where effective cleaning is required.
- Provision of adequate changing facilities for nursing staff.
- Length of time that intravenous cannulae (for giving medicines directly into a vein) are in place.
- Use of bar coding as an aid to patient safety.
- Outpatient waiting times and queuing information systems.
- Transport and parking for patients and visitors.
- Provision of toilet and hand washing facilities.
- Establishment of Governor/Member/Patient contact sessions in local and hospital settings.



The Governors will seek assurance that the processes and systems for these issues to be progressed are working. Individual personal issues or requests for information are progressed through the Complaints Department (telephone: 0117 342 3604) and the Patient Advice and Liaison Service (telephone: 0117 342 3571).
