NHSi also thanked leaders, and all staff, for their enormous efforts over recent weeks.	
	Care Quality Commission Robert Woolley provided a brief update on the recent Care Quality Commission inspection, confirming that the Trust had received positive verbal feedback from inspectors on the pride and confidence of staff and the great focus on care and compassion within the Trust. He advised that a draft report	



	for review of factual accuracy from the Care Quality Commission would be available in February 2017. Sustainability and Transformation Plan Robert Woolley confirmed UH Bristol is actively helping Weston General Hospital and is taking forward service reviews in certain areas. Executive Summary

<u>Purpose:</u> In line with the Trust's Constitution, one of the general duties of the Council of Governors is to hold the Non-Executive Directors individually and collectively to account for the performance of the Board of Directors. This new report outlines the forums in which the governors have held Non-executive Directors to account in the last quarter. It is a summary of this one area of governor activity, the overall programme of governor activity is available at item 7.1a.

24 January 2017 - 20 April 2017

- Governors attended the public meetings of the Trust Board of Directors on 31 January, 28 February and 30 March to observe the Non-executive Directors holding the Executive Directors to account.
- Non-executive Directors attended meetings of the Governors' Quality Focus Group on17 March, the Governors' Strategy Group on 9 February and 11 April, and the Governors' Constitution Focus Group on 2 March. The Quality Focus Group receives the Quality and Outcomes Committee Chair's report, the Strategy Group receives the Finance Committee Chair's report and the Constitution Focus Group receives the Audit Committee Chair's report. These reports provide evidence to give governors assurance

that Non-executive Directors are discharging their duties effectively as members of the Board, and are an opportunity for governors to discuss the content.

- Governors hold regular and informal Counsel Meetings with the Chairman and Nonexecutive Directors. These are chaired by a Non-executive Director on a rotational basis and provide an informal opportunity to seek information from Non-executive Directors in relation to their areas of focus. There were two Counsel meetings in this period. Assurance was requested around the following general topics:
 - Chairman's/NEDs' Counsel meeting on 24 February: Patient/public amenities; patient discharge; entitlement to NHS treatment; the NHS e-referral service; patient flow.
 - Chairman's/NEDs' Counsel meeting on 27 March: CQC inspection; Independent Review of Children's Cardiac Services; A&E waits; Sustainability and Transformation Plans; social care pressures.

Where Non-executive Directors are unable to answer governor questions, governors have use of the governors' log of communication ns – a practical mechanism for supporting good two-way communication between governors and Trust executives – see item 9.1

Summary of key matters considered by the Committee and any related decisions made.

Meeting on 6 March 2017

Emma Woollett and Alison Ryan chaired this meeting.

Succession planning: Governors received a report on succession planning for Non-executive roles. Among the report's recommendations were:

- Julian Dennis would take over as Quality and Outcomes Committee Chair from 1 June 2017 (as Alison Ryan would be taking a one-year sabbatical from August).
- A new Non-executive Director would be required to Chair the Finance Committee (as Lisa Gardner's final term of office would be ending on 30 November 2017). This had been reflected in brief to the recruitment consultants in their search for new NEDs.
- Jill Youds would take over from Emma Woollett as Senior Independent Director (SID).
 To provide good handover of the Speaking Out aspect of SID, Emma would handover to Jill on 1 June 2017.
- Jill would step down from Finance Committee and QOC on the arrival of new NEDs but as SID would join the Audit Committee.

Non-executive Director and Chair Appointments: Governors received an update on the appointment process for Non-executive Directors and Chairman, including a revised timeline. The extent of governor involvement in the process was discussed and agreed.

Meeting on 27 March 2017

John Savage and Alison Ryan chaired this meeting.

Non-executive Director Appraisals and Re-appointments

- The committee noted the appraisal reports for Jill Youds and Julian Dennis.
- The committee recommended to the Council of Governors the re-appointment of Jill Youds and Julian Dennis as Non-executive Directors for a second 3-year term until 31 May 2020 and 27 November 2020 respectively.

Non-executive Director and Chair Appointments: A progress report was noted. It was

agreed that a further progress report on the Chair's appointment would be received at the April Council of Governors meeting.

Forward Planner: The committee reviewed the forward planner for business to be discussed by the committee during 2017/18.

Committee membership

The Council of Governors is asked to note that eight of the 12 members of the Nominations and Appointments Committee will reach the end of their terms of office on 31 May. Six out of those eight will not be standing again. There will therefore be at least 6 vacancies. Both new and remaining governors will be invited in June to join the committee. Executive Summary

Purpose:

The purpose of this report is to provide an update to the Council of Governors (COG) with respect to appointment of the Chairman and Non-executive Directors.

Background:

John Savage's final term of office as Chairman will end on 30 November 2017. Two further Non-executive Directors (Emma Woollett and Lisa Gardner) are also nearing the end of their terms of office, and one is taking a sabbatical year out (Alison Ryan). Key issues in relation to Chairman's Recruitment:

The Governors' Nominations and Appointments Committee would usually play a key role in the appointment of the Chair. However, eight of the 12 Committee members will reach the end of their terms of office on 31 May. Six out of those eight will not be standing again. Committee membership will not be refreshed until appointments are approved at the Council of Governors meeting on 28 July.

In order to ensure adequate governor representation in the process, it is therefore recommended that three governors from the Nominations and Appointments Committee join the selection panel; and that several governors from the remaining pool of governors be invited to participate in the focus groups.

The Lead Governor role will also be changing on 1 June. One of the current Lead Governors (Mo Schiller) will be therefore involved in the longlisting process in April, with one of the new Lead Governors to be involved in the shortlisting process in June.

The selection process will include three structured discussion groups with Executive Directors of the Trust, non-executive directors and governors.

Meeting held on 24/2/2017

An extra Quality Focus Group meeting was arranged for 24 February 2017. Chris Swonnell (Head of Quality, patient experience and clinical effectiveness) attended this meeting to discuss with governors:

- Quarter 3 update on progress of Corporate Quality Objectives
- Draft Corporate Quality Objectives for 2017-18.

Highlights of the meeting were:

- Care and Quality Commission inspection report to be published 02 March;
- Q3 report presented at Quality and Outcomes Committee in January
- 5 quality objectives carried forward to 2017/18 (objectives 1, 4, 7, 10 and 12 from 2016/17)
- There are 8 proposed objectives set for 2017/18, possibly 9. Re objective 8 'an objective to be agreed around the theme of customer service'; Chris Swonnell explained that Simon Chamberlain and Paul Lewis are a developing some initial thinking about this objective, which will draw together and add to existing Trust training/activity in the area of customer service. This will include a carry forward of the 2016/17 objective relating to telephone communications. Chris's understanding was that a governor representative had been invited to join the group which would have oversight of the customer services objective.

Meeting held on 17/3/2017

- Quality Report: The Quality Report 2015/6 had been circulated to governors prior to the
 meeting for reference purposes. Chris Swonnell (Head of Quality, patient experience and
 clinical effectiveness) explained the Governor's role for the report and discussed the third
 indicator. Governors approved the third quality indicator as "Number of patients with
 timely discharge".
- Presentation on the CQC Report an overview of the Trust's performance: Carolyn Mills (Chief Nurse) talked governors through the briefing report which had been presented to UH Bristol staff by Robert Woolley. This presentation was circulated to all governors prior to the meeting.
- Quality and Outcomes Committee Chair's update: Alison Ryan, Chair of the Quality and Outcomes Committee, introduced the report from the meeting of the Quality and Outcomes Committee held on February 2017. She highlighted several key aspects including ORLA, Safe working hours guardian, Quarterly workforce and organisational development report and the Quality Performance Report.
- Quality and Performance Report Q&As: Governors had received the Trust's Quality
 and Performance Report from February and were given the opportunity to seek assurance
 about areas of the Trust's performance from Carolyn Mills, Chief Nurse. The key issues
 raised by governors for assurance were the increase in agency usage along with sickness
 absence, the high numbers of Band 5 nurse leavers in CICU and the low performance
 percentage in neurology for patients waiting over the 18 week national target. Assurance
 was given.
- Accessible Information Standard: Jennifer Pollock (AIS Implementation Officer) was in attendance to give a verbal presentation to the group on the progress with the implementation of the Accessible Information Standard (AIS) - she explained AIS is a new mandatory standard that all NHS and publicly funded adult social care services must follow.

Any Other Business:

- The Governors' Log of Communications was noted.
- There was no further update on the discussions with North Bristol Trust in relation to the cellular pathology service. Malcolm Watson, Public Governor, informed the group a new pathologist has been appointed.
- Governor representation for Voluntary Services steering Group Carolyn brought forward a suggestion from Chris Swonnell for a governor representative to attend the Voluntary Services Steering Group meetings, which will be discussed further at the Governor Development Seminar.

MEETING HELD ON 09/02/2017

- **IDEA Group**: Clive Hamilton confirmed that Mily Yogananth has been nominated as governor representative for this group. Governors present agreed to rotate the governor position on a quarterly basis.
- Headlines from Finance Director's Report April 2017: Jeremy Spearing, Associate
 Director of Finance, talked governors through his paper titled 'Highlights from the report
 of the finance director'. He explained this paper is a condensed version of the finance
 director's report which went to Trust Board on 31 January 2017 and should be
 considered in the context of the Trust's strategic thinking. He welcomed any comments
 regarding the content from governors.
- Finance Committee Chair's Update: Jill Youds, Non-executive Director and Chair of the Finance Committee, gave a brief update. The main topic of conversation was the car park scheme. Jeremy Spearing explained UH Bristol are concluding the procurement process; private sector bidders were asked to formulate proposals to design, build, finance and operate a car park with 820 spaces (this new car park will also re-home the multi storey car park currently next to THQ).
- Sustainability and Transformation Plan update: Paula Clarke, Director of Strategy and Transformation, gave a presentation to governors on the plan and its progress. Areas discussed were The STP submission, local and national context; Principle aims and vision; Key principles and areas of focus; Prevention, early intervention and self-care; integrated primary and community care; Acute care collaboration and STP next steps.
- Any other business: There was nothing to note.

MEETING HELD ON 11/04/2017

- **IDEA Group:** Mily Yogananth attended the first IDEA group meeting held on 27 March and circulated the minutes from this meeting to governors. The group decided there should be a deputy governor representative and suggested this be a newly elected governor.
- Headlines from Finance Director's Report April 2017: This report was circulated prior to today's meeting. In Jeremy's absence Clive highlighted several areas to the group. The group had a lengthy discussion regarding nursing and midwifery pay particularly the overspend on agency and bank staff and flexible working.
- **Finance Committee Chair's Update:** The Finance Committee Chair's Report, presented at Trust Board on 30 March, was circulated to governors prior to today's meeting. Jill welcomed questions from governors.
- Update on Operating Plan and delivery priorities: Paula recalled that, in December's meeting, she reported the first draft narrative had been submitted to NHS Improvement. Feedback has now been received and Paula confirmed the plan was resubmitted on 23 March with changes to the finance sections and some of the trajectories.
- Any other business: Weston Partnership progress update: Clive informed the group he had attended one of the public consultation meetings and the group discussed issues that were raised.

Summary of key matters considered by the Committee and any related decisions made.

- **Membership Report**: Kate Hanlon (Interim Head of Membership and Governance) updated the group on membership numbers. As of 22 February 2017, Foundation Trust membership stands at 20,358. Kate explained there has been a fall in numbers; this is due to the database being updated and the removal of members who have moved/opted out.
- **Health Matters Event**: The next Health Matters Event will be held on Wednesday 17 May, 18:00 19:30hrs. The topic will be skin cancer.
- Election update: There are now 14 governor seats up for election as Maria Wahab has indicated that she will stand down at the end of May 2017. Nominations have now closed with a great response of 29 nominees. Voting opens 28 April 2017 and closes on 24 May 2017.
- Appointed Governor Roles: The Council of Governors has nine appointed governor seats, seven of which will end 31 May 2017. Jeanette Jones will have served for a total of nine years by 31 May; all others are eligible for re-appointment. Voluntary/Community appointed governor role Members agreed to take a recommendation to the next meeting around the removal of this vacancy from the Constitution. Bristol City Council (BCC) appointed governor role Kate explained Carole Johnson is the current appointed governor for BCC (since September 2016) and suggested liaising with other Councils at the end of Carole's new term of office. South West Ambulance Service NHS FT (SWAST) and Avon & Wiltshire Mental Health Partnership appointed governor role Pam agreed to talk with the Trust Secretaries of both organisations and update the group at the next meeting. Governors agreed to discuss changes to the constitution at the next meeting in June regarding the above appointed roles. Any proposed changes to the constitution can then presented at Council of Governors on 28 July 2017.
- Lead Governor role: Members noted that the lead governor role description and nomination form which were used last year were circulated to all governors prior to the meeting. Kate Hanlon explained last year, all governors were sent these forms via e-mail.

The election process ran through April and closed one week before Council of Governors (28 April) when the results will be approved. Governors present agreed for the same process to be repeated for this year. Following a discussion on the benefit of two governors sharing the lead governor role, Pam and Kate agreed to amend the role description to reflect this opportunity.

- Confirmation of project focus group leads: Members agreed to the following nominations for the governor leads for each focus group from 1 June 2017 to 31 May 2018: Governors Strategy Group – Malcolm Watson; Constitution Focus Group – Ray Phipps; Quality Focus Group – Carole Dacombe.
- Non –Executive Director (designate): Pam Wenger, Trust Secretary, explained a process is under way in relation to appointment of NED Observers. This is part of succession planning which is to bring in NED observers so, when a vacancy opens up they are better placed to commence the role. Pam described how the title of 'observer' has no specific reference in the Trust Constitution and proposed the Constitution be changed to include some detail on the role of Non-executive Directors (Designate). Members agreed to bring back the changes at the next meeting, ahead of approval at Council of Governors on 28 July 2017.
- Matters reserved for the Council of Governors: Pam Wenger, Trust Secretary, presented a draft paper titled 'Schedule of Decisions reserved for the Board of Directors and Council of Governors'. This was presented as a work in progress document and is to help governors to understand total clarity to where decision making powers lie.
- Audit Committee Chair's Report from January 2017: John Moore (Non-executive Director and Chair of the Audit Committee) provided an update to the group on key matters considered by the Audit Committee on 17 January 2017.
- Induction process for governors: The governors' induction pack was circulated to all
 governors in advance of the meeting for review, presenting an overview of the current
 content compared with documents for inclusion as suggested by ICSA and Governwell.
 Kate explained potential changes for new governor inductions in June 2017, with
 governors likely now to attend the one day volunteer induction programme, more
 streamlined and better tailored to the volunteer governor role rather than the three day
 corporate induction.
- Any other business: There was no other business to note.
 Pam concluded by thanking Kate for her hard work and her leadership in making significant improvements to the communication materials, the engagement processes and the overall running of the membership function. Staff and governors have recognised a huge change in approach and materials and thanked Kate for setting the direction for membership for when Amanda returns in May.

UH Bristol Governor Elections 2017 Report to Council of Governors meeting on 28 April 2017

1.0 Background

The Council of Governors has 27 elected seats. The elections are staggered on a three-year cycle with half of the Council elected in 2016 and half in 2017, and no elections scheduled to run in 2018. There were 14 seats up for election this year.

2.0 Publicity for nominations

Promotion to encourage people to stand for election included the following:

- All Patient and Public members were informed about the elections by letter or email and invited to stand. Staff members were informed via Newsbeat. The Trust's volunteers were also invited to consider putting themselves forward. We also promoted the elections via Above & Beyond and on the jobs and volunteering opportunities page of Voscur's website (Voscur is a charity that provides direct support services and specialist advice to voluntary organisations across Bristol).
- Press releases were sent to Bristol and North Somerset media (featuring Kathy Baxter and Clive Hamilton)
- Social media updates (including quotes, photos and key messages from a number of governors), including a video posted on the Trust Facebook page about the governor role featuring Carole Dacombe, which received more than 1200 views.
- We held three lively information events at the Trust in February-March at which members of the public and staff found about the role from governors and the Chairman.
- We held a staff information stand at the Chief Executive's all-staff briefing on 15 March. Staff governor Andy Coles-Driver helped to promote the staff governor role in the associated video briefing.
- We held an information stand in Clevedon on 9 March to target our North Somerset constituency.
- Flyers in main areas of our hospitals and posters distributed by governors
- A range of stakeholder organisations in the region were notified and sent posters to circulate.

2.0 Nominations

Nominations for election were open from 7 March to 4 April. At the close of nominations we had received 29 nominations from prospective governors (to fill 14 vacancies). Nominations were received for all constituencies.

Attached as item 4.2a is the Statement of Candidates, which shows the names of all the candidates against the seats they are standing for. There are candidates standing in all of the vacant seats.

One candidate was elected unopposed (see item 4.2b), Bala Thyagarajan, who was standing in the Medical and Dental constituency. Bala will take up his seat on the Council of Governors on 1 June 2017.

3.0 Next steps – voting

There will be elections in the other six constituencies from 28 April to 24 May 2017. Results will be declared on 25 May and new governors will take up office on 1 June. Governor elections are conducted in accordance with the Model Election Rules, which form part of the Trust's Constitution, and will be run by Electoral Reform Services (ERS). The Membership Office has already been publicising the opportunity to vote for governors, both within the Trust (regarding staff elections) and externally with members (for public and patient governors). We will continue to publicise voting in the run up to and during the voting period to try to increase the turnout.

4.0 Recommendations

Executive Summary

Membership engagement report

1.0 SITUATION

The Trust has a formal requirement to maintain a Foundation Trust membership and a responsibility to engage with its membership. This report provides the Council of Governors with current membership details, a summary of membership engagement since the last Council of Governors meeting on 31 January 2017 and an update on progress against the Membership Engagement and Governor Development Strategy (April 2015).

2.0 BACKGROUND

At 20 April 2017, Foundation Trust membership stands at 19,610 members (5,500 public members; 3,873 patient members; 10,237 staff members).

This compares with membership at 23 January 2017 of 20,506 members (6,018 public members; 4,243 patient members; 10,245 staff members). The staff membership was refreshed at the end of December and again at the end of March 2017 and includes only those staff members who are eligible for membership according to the Constitution, i.e. those on a contract of work of, or continuously employed by the Trust for at least 12 months.

Areas of progress against the Membership Engagement and Governor Development Strategy

Elections: In line with the priorities for the Membership Office agreed with the Constitution Focus Group at the end of 2016 and presented to the Council of Governors in January 2017, during the last quarter we have focused on the area of election campaigning to fill the 14 vacancies. The Governor Elections report (item 4.2 on the agenda) details the range of activities undertaken over the past three months and the outcome of the campaign.

Voices Mail-out and Response: At the same time we acted on the opportunity of using the first 2017 edition of Voices to engage with our public and patient membership by including a cover letter from the Chairman with every copy of the magazine sent to members by post (i.e. to all members for whom we do not have an email address). The letter included information about the upcoming elections and Annual Members Meeting alongside a request for members to confirm the accuracy of their contact details and provide an email address, where possible.

We saw a huge response to the mail-out, receiving around **1000 replies** in the months of March and April. While the majority of those who responded (around 750 members) asked to be removed from membership, we also received positive feedback about the Trust and about Voices magazine. Some members replied simply to confirm that they like our current method of communication. We also increased the number of email addresses for members by around 200 (we now have email addresses for 2,748 members, or 29% of our membership).

We had anticipated a fall in numbers as a result of this mailshot (particularly as the Trust had recruited 84% of its public and patient members between 2007 and 2010). We have also been working since the end of 2016 to address the large backlog of 'gone aways' flagged on the membership database, i.e. those members whose postal address appeared to be incorrect. We have therefore seen a reduction of around 1,500 public and patient members in the last six months.

As reported to Council in January 2017, we will review membership engagement methods and practices, and plans for targeting underrepresented members and constituencies where we fall below minimum numbers in the last quarter of the year.

Membership engagement: Aside from the opportunity to engage with members through the election campaign and through the mail out of Voices, we have also maintained our monthly e-newsletter updates to our patient and public members with email addresses over the last quarter:

- 27 January 2017 Voices magazine, opportunity to get involved in UH Bristol Cancer Steering Group or as Trust volunteer; feedback on NICE proposals for improving public engagement with its work; governor elections
- 13 February 2017 Details about the upcoming elections and governor election information events
- 3 March 2017 Care Quality Commission rating, formal partnership with Weston, South Bristol Community Hospital celebrations and governor elections
- 12 April 2017 Launch of the Biomedical Research Centre and integrated sexual health services, Health Matters event on skin cancer, and the outcome of the elections.

Going forwards we propose including a short governor message in member enewsletters on a rotational basis so that governors have a further opportunity to feedback to their constituents about their activities.

Voices magazine: The members' page in the staff edition for March/April focused on the upcoming staff elections, reminding staff to vote. The May/June edition will focus on the reflections on their terms in office from governors standing down in May.

Health Matters events: The Health Matters event in March was postponed to 17 May 2017. The event will focus on skin cancer, with a summary of the CQC inspection results as the introduction. We are currently in the planning stages for the July, November and March 2018 events.

3.0 ASSESSMENT

The last quarter has seen a step forward in terms of membership engagement activity. Through the election campaign we have been in contact with a range of people, both members and non-members. Through the Voices mail-out we have had many positive interactions with members. The resulting reduction in membership numbers means that we are more likely to have members who want to be members and we can focus on better quality engagement. Benefits also include reduced costs for future Voices magazine mail-outs and a reduction in the number of ballot papers being mailed out unnecessarily.

Executive Summary

For Approval

<u>Purpose:</u> The purpose of this report is to provide the Council with a brief overview of the role appointed governors play on the Council and /or for appointed governors to share any relevant updates from their own organisation. Executive Summary

<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of this report is to provide an update to the Council of Governors with respect to appointment of the external auditors for the Trust for the three year period commencing 2017-2020. **Governors will receive a presentation at the meeting to explain who the preferred supplier is, and will then be asked to vote on whether they approve appointment.**

Key issues to note:

The Constitution requires the Council of Governors to appoint or remove the external auditor of the Trust. At the Council of Governors meeting on 31 October, it was agreed to set up an Auditor Selection Panel as a task-and-finish group to oversee the appointment. The group was made up of three governors (Angelo Micciche, Clive Hamilton and Graham Briscoe) and three non-executive directors (John Moore – Panel Chair, Alison Ryan and Lisa Gardner) with several Trust officers attending in an advisory capacity.

The panel met twice in November and December to agree the route for appointment, the outline tender specification, proposed evaluation criteria and a proposed timeline. The panel then convened two further times in March to review the tenders received and to receive presentations from the preferred suppliers. Four organisations tendered for the role and three

were shortlisted: Delo	itte; KPM	G; PWC.

Governor training and development report

1.0 SITUATION

The Council of Governors has responsibilities that are set out in Acts of Parliament such as the *Health and Social Care Act 2012*. This report provides an update on the current composition of the Council of Governors, a review of governor compliance to statutory requirements and a summary of how governors have discharged their responsibilities in areas including engagement with members and holding Non-executive Directors to account.

2.0 BACKGROUND

As of 20 April 2017 there were 32 governors in post and four vacancies, as follows:

Public governors: Pauline Beddoes, Malcolm Watson, Graham Briscoe, Clive Hamilton, Carole Dacombe, Tom Frewin, Mo Schiller, Sue Silvey, Bob Bennett, Hussein Amiri and Jonathan Seymour-Williams.

Patient governors: Rashid Joomun, Kathy Baxter, Ray Phipps, Anne Skinner, Angelo Micciche, Edmund Brooks, Garry Williams, Sue Milestone, Lorna Watson and one vacancy.

Staff governors: Mily Yogananth, Karen Stevens, Andy Coles-Driver, Ian Davies, Maria Wahab and Florene Jordan.

Appointed governors: Carole Johnson, Tim Peters, Marc Griffiths, Jeanette Jones, Beatrice Lander, Olivia Garrett and three vacancies (Voluntary/Community Group representative; South Western Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust, and Avon & Wiltshire Mental Health Partnership).

We are continuing to work with both South Western Ambulance Service NHS Foundation Trust, and Avon & Wiltshire Mental Health Partnership to find a solution to these long-term vacancies. At the Constitution Focus Group in March, members agreed to take a recommendation to the June Constitution Focus Group meeting around the removal of the Voluntary/Community Group representative from the Constitution.

Statutory requirements

Two governor DBS checks remain outstanding and are being pursued between the Membership Office and HR team. Governors are reminded that a DBS check is an essential requirement of their role as outlined in the Trust Constitution (section 16.2). Governors who do not have a DBS check will not be permitted to undertake any patient facing activity within the Trust. The Trust Secretary is also currently reviewing the DBS check process with HR.

Governor development

The governor development programme was established to provide governors with the necessary core training and development of their skills to perform the statutory



duties of governors effectively. This includes quarterly governor development seminars, among other briefings for governors.

On 24 February the governors received a presentation from Andy Burgess, Divisional Director of Medicine, on the structure of the division, successes, challenges and priorities for 2017-18.

There has been one Governor Development Seminar since the last Council of Governors meeting, which took place on 6 April 2017 and focused on the following topics:

- An update for governors on the implementation of the 2016 junior doctors' contract from Alistair Johnstone, Safe Working Hours Guardian.
- An overview of the role of external audit at UH Bristol, presented by Chris Wlaznik from PwC, including an outline of the purpose of the Limited Assurance Report.
- A presentation on the work of Information Management & Technology at UH Bristol, exploring the successes, challenges and outlook for the service.
- A session on the Voluntary Services team; looking at the vision for volunteering, new and existing volunteer roles, achievements and key objectives for 2017-2020.

The next seminar will take place on Wednesday 14 June. This seminar will be the first development seminar for the new governor intake.

Governor engagement

An overview of individual governor activity for the period 31 Jan - 7 April 2017 is attached as item 8.1a. This activity report shows the breadth of governor activities, including opportunities to engage with members, both within and outside the Trust, and links with partner organisations, alongside any external training completed.

3.0 ASSESSMENT

As reported in January, in line with new priorities for the Membership Office we will focus on preparing for the induction of new governors from May through to August. We are working with the Voluntary Services team to review the corporate induction process to provide more tailored essential training, in line with the training provided to our Trust volunteers. This will include the required annual fire safety training and information governance training. The Membership Office is continuing to work with divisions to provide regular updates for governors.

Are the executives aware of a pilot study taking place at a small number of trusts to replace DNAR in older or chronically ill patients with RESPECT for the patient/family decision, and would this trust look at making any changes to DNAR following the outcome of this pilot study?

We are aware of ReSPECT and the ReSPECT document was made available in February. As a trust we welcome the opportunity to find out more about ReSPECT from the national working group that was set up in 2015 which represents membership from a wide spectrum of groups. This includes the Resuscitation Council (UK), British Medical Association, Royal College of Nursing, Patient & Public groups, General Medical Council, and Associated Royal Colleges.

ReSPECT stands for Recommended Summary Plan for Emergency Care & Treatment a 'process that creates personalised recommendations for a person's clinical care in a future emergency in which they are unable to make or express choices.'

The Trust resuscitation group discussed it at the Resuscitation Committee meeting this month and we have expressed our interest in receiving further information from the Resuscitation Council (UK) about the implementation of ReSPECT. We have also liaised with BNSSG to join a small working group as we recognise the importance of collaborative working that will be needed with patients and the wider healthcare community to support the implementation of ReSPECT. The wider healthcare community recognise that this change will take time.

Following this review changes would be made to our DNACPR and TEPP (Treatment Escalation Personalised Plan) processes. However the guidance from the Resuscitation Council recommends that Existing DNACPR forms and TEPP forms will continue to be effective and do not need to be replaced immediately. They recommend that when healthcare communities implement the ReSPECT process there must be a robust plan to ensure that existing DNACPR forms or TEPPs remain valid for a substantial period of overlap. They explain that 'ReSPECT is not just a replacement for a DNACPR form; the aim is to promote recording an emergency care plan by many more people, including many whose ReSPECT forms will recommend active treatment, including attempted CPR if it should be needed.

One of the medical consultant representatives from the Resuscitation Committee is also meeting with me on 12th April to explain ReSPECT in more detail and to look at the how we could introduce ReSPECT at the trust.
