UHBristol Research Capability Funding (RCF)

NOW OPEN - The Autumn 2017 joint call for University Hospitals Bristol Research Capability Funding and Above and Beyond grants.

Research Capability Funding (RCF) awarded annually to UHBristol by the NIHR is based on our NIHR grant income. RCF is used to help NHS organisations attract, develop and retain high quality research active staff. The call is now open for UHBristol RCF funded grants, of up to £20,000, which can be used to:

a) Fund Research Sessions/PAs (for medical and non-medical staff) to allow time to prepare NIHR research grant applications; and/or

b) Fund the generation of preliminary or underpinning data to support an NIHR application; a "pump-priming" grant.

Above & Beyond generously allocate funds to research in UHBristol, and the call is now open for Above and Beyond research grants (up to £20,000). These grants aim to promote high quality biomedical research in UHBristol. Applications are welcome from any medical or non-medical UHBristol employee, or university academic (Universities of Bristol and the West of England) holding an honorary contract with UHBristol.

PLEASE NOTE: FOR THE 2017 GRANT CALLS, THE EMPHASIS WILL BE ON PUMP-PRIMING NIHR GRANTS. We know from past applications for NIHR grants that they have a much better chance of success (double) if they previously received RCF funding than those without. This is perhaps not surprising since the dedicated time and/or preliminary work allow for a much stronger application, but is nevertheless encouraging to see this borne out by our success rate with NIHR grant applications.



Percentage of commercial clinical trials closed to recruitment during the reporting period meeting time to target



This data is taken from EDGE on a rolling 12 months basis. Latest figures therefore show number of clinical trials closed to recruitment in reporting period between 01/07/2016 and 30/06/2017 meeting time to target (i.e. the preceding 12 months). The adjusted line excludes trials where recruitment to target cannot be influenced locally (e.g. very rare patient group where we may not see any patients at all or follow-on/extension trials) and where the defined recruitment window was closed earlier than the date provided in the contract.

3. Celebrating Successes

Bristol Eye Hospital research

Endophthalmitis defensin study (EDS) study

The EDS study is a case-controlled UH Bristol sponsored study that aims to assess whether a specific HBD-1 genetic profile is associated with endophthalmitis, (inflammation in the eye which is often caused by infection and which can be sight-threatening), following a range of intraocular procedures. The CI is Mr Haynes here at the BEH and there are 3 UK sites: BEH, Taunton and Sunderland. The BEH site was given Green Light on Monday 25 July and the first patient was recruited into the study at BEH on the 26 July. (PI: Richard Haynes, POC: Helen Talbot)

OPHT 4170 (AMD) study

Safety and Efficacy of Abicipar Pegol (AGN-150998) in Patients with Neovascular Age-related Macular Degeneration.

The team recruited 8 patients against a target of 8 and were the second highest recruiter to the sequoia trial and had the highest target of all sites. (PI: Abosede Cole)

1. Clinical research fellow awards sessional awards

These will be awarded to fund a period of research activity for up to three years for clinicians in training. It is anticipated that these will be part funded by the David Telling trust; and/or a service commitment is encouraged funded by the employing trust, and/or funding will also be sought from the Clinical research network West of England for time to develop and perform NIHR portfolio work. These awards thus offer the possibility of developing a research career that can be integrated into clinical training pathways and practice.

2. One year Research Fellowship

Funding is again available for a, for a medical/surgical trainee wishing to take a year out of clinical practice to undertake research. The award will cover the salary costs only of the successful applicant. To apply, please use the attached grant application guidance to describe the research proposed, but also include a CV of the potential research fellow and a) a one side of A4 sheet describing the applicants background and why he/she would benefit from the award and

b) a letter of confirmation from the applicants consultant supervisor confirming that the applicant is suitable for the award and that the department involved has the necessary infrastructure, equipment and facilities to support the fellowship and c) a note of the annual salary requested.

3. £25000 Pump-priming Grants

These are pump priming awards. They are flexible to get new researchers of all professions started.

Please note that we can accept applications for both research grants and medical equipment for up to £25000, although more may be available for medical equipment if there is a strong case for it (there should be clear patient benefit and a reason why the NHS will not fund it).
