## A report of activities during the past few years

Having raised and purchased an Open Scanner at a cost of 1.2 million – we still maintain it and have purchased additional items to use on this for research purposes. We have also accomplished the following:

1. We **updated the scanner** at a cost of £200,000.
2. We built the **information/patient support room** and paid the salary for 2 years of the coordinator until the NHS took over the post. We now pay the full salary of their assistant.
3. We built the **Quiet Room** at a cost of £20,000.
4. We have purchased a **site rite scanner** for the theatre at a cost of £6,465.
5. We have purchased two additional **infusion pumps** at a cost of £1,600.
6. We support nurses and radiographers to go on **courses and conferences**, allocating £3,000 to each profession yearly.
7. We purchased the **stereotactic digital X-Ray machine** at a cost of approximately £290,000.
8. We have provided a **study room for staff** which will ultimately benefit the patients at a cost of £18,000.
9. We provided **Xboxes and wii games consoles** for wards 61 and 62.
10. In 2005, we paid for the **decoration of wards 61 and 62** at a cost of just over £14,000.
11. In 2008 the House Committee **replaced the curtains and blinds** to the two wards at a cost of £14,500.
12. In 2009 they provided **bedside consoles incorporating TV, radio and telephone** to each bed at a cost of £70,000.
13. A **Head & Neck immobiliser** was purchased at a cost of £67,500, a **brachytherapy machine** for £130,000 and **Elektra synergy** for £550,000.
14. A **patient trolley** for the brachytherapy department costing £6,500 and currently £3,950 for **breast gowns**.
