Dear Sir/Madam

Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trusts response is as follows:

1. The number of people that are logged, as numerical breakdown between 2010 to 2018 present month, on a monthly basis by security that have been called on to patients with mental health issues visiting the trust?

The Trust does not record whether the incidents that security are called to relate to patients with mental health issues: therefore the Trust does not hold this information.

2. The number of people that have been issued with any enforcement or ban or any other remit using CJI Act 2008? Between 2010 and 2018 on a monthly basis? The correlation between those that have had mental health issues and they have been issued a ban or any other form of warning etc. under CJI Act 2008?

Please note: Where the figures are between 1 and 5, this has been denoted by *. We are not able to provide the requested monthly breakdown, as due to the low numbers, we have considered that there is the potential for individuals to be identified from the information provided, when considered with other information that may also be in the public domain. In our view disclosure of these low figures would breach one of the Data

Protection Principles set out in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act, namely Principle 1. The Trust therefore finds that the Section 40(2) exemption contained within the Freedom of information Act 2000 is engaged. (Section 40 is the exemption for personal information).

3. The number of times police have been called to A&E for people in Mental Health Crisis between 2010 and 2018 on a monthly basis as a breakdown?

The Trust does not hold this information.

4. The age, gender and ethnicity and nationality, of people that have attended A&E with Mental Health Issues between 2010 and 2018 on a monthly basis?

The Trust does not hold this information.
