Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

- Does the trust operate any clinical decision support systems (examples above)

 a. If so, which ones?
- 2. What is the cost of licences (and any other support) the Trust paid on clinical decision support systems in the financial years 2017-18 & 2018-19

To assist you, what I mean by clinical decision support systems, these are stand alone or integrated software which helps clinical staff make safe decisions and take appropriate action. The can be algorithms, care plans, clinical referencing, or clinical condition specific guidelines which incorporate treatment or decision making.

Proprietary examples include:

University Hospitals Bristol NHS Foundation Trust is using many systems, has hundreds of policies and follows all national guidelines. Not all systems are centrally managed by the Trust's IT department. In addition, most of the systems could potentially be used for decision-making. To identify and share all those systems, policies and guidelines would take the Trust more than 18 hours to complete and it is therefore exempt from disclosure under Section 12 of the FOI Act.

However, from the examples of the systems you have provided the Trust was able to identify that it uses UPtodate from company Wolters Kluwer. The system is used approximately 40,000 times a year at a cost of 51,000 in 2019/20 and 47,000 in 2018/19.

The Trust also has access to BMJ Best Practice via a national subscription from Health Education England.

3. Has the trust developed their own electronic clinical decision support system(s)?

The Trust uses algorithms for decision making for various cases but as per question 1 and 2, these are too many to share and used in various departments.

 If so, what were the WTE and total funding costs incurred in development of their own clinical decision support system(s) for the financial years 2017-18 & 2018-19 respectively.

The Trust does not hold this information. In the case that employees were involved in the writing of scripts and algorithms this would be part of their day-to-day role.

5. What was the Trusts' total operating budget for financial years 2017-18 & 2018-19 respectively.

This information is exempt from disclosure under Section 21 the FOI Act as it is already reasonably accessible by other means. Please see our website at http://www.uhbristol.nhs.uk/about-us/key-publications/. The Trust's annual reports include the information requested.
