#### Freedom of Information Request

Dear Sir/Madam

Thank you for your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The Trust's response is as follows:

## Request:

Please could you kindly send me any information you may hold relating persons who have died with no known next of kin\* (\*defined as blood relatives, this would include patients who have listed next of kin but where such persons are friends or non-blood relatives) since 1/2/20 to the day of your reply, or as close as possible to this date. Please include:

- 1. full names of deceased persons,
- 2. dates of death,
- 3. marital status.
- 4. maiden surnames of married or widowed females,
- 5. dates of birth or ages at death,
- 6. last known addresses,
- 7. estimated value of estates, if known.

## Response:

University Hospitals Bristol NHS Foundation Trust considers this information is exempt from disclosure under section 41(1)(a)(b), Information provided in confidence.

This information about the deceased individuals does not require a signed confidentiality agreement; it merely requires information to have 'the quality of confidence' and be provided under an obligation on confidence. All deceased individuals provided their personal information whilst being alive and expected that it would be treated confidentially therefore the Trust retains the duty of confidentiality after death. We therefore believe any identifying material is absolutely exempt from disclosure.

In addition to the above exemption the Trust is applying section 31(1)(a), as information on addresses of potentially empty houses would be likely to prejudice the prevention or detection of crime for identity fraud, theft of physical assets from a deceased's estate and criminal trespass.
